The 2017 Reunion will be all about Hatfield Family Traditions

Steve Hatfield). Marlene maintained that she didn't do anything to require discipline, but the others thought it was because she was under the protection of her grandmother, "Ma" (Nancy Jane Morris). There were instances in which each would "get away" with something such as when Guy Hatfield would tell Janet he didn't like her short shorts. She would wait awhile until his attention was turned or he was gone and then she would put them back on. The discussion that induced the most interaction among the group was the difference in the norms when the first cousins went to Eastern Kentucky University in the '50's as compared to modern college norms. For example, the women had a curfew of 9:00 PM on weekend days and after that the doors were locked. If you missed the curfew, you could be grounded in the dorm for a

weekend. Women were not allowed to wear shorts on campus, so if they were leaving the dorm in shorts, they would put on a raincoat to hide it. They had to wear skirts to class and could only wear slacks on the weekend. If they were leaving for the weekend, they had to sign out and have parental permission. Of course, these rules did not apply to the men.

Throughout the weekend, the family celebrated the 100th anniversary of the birth of Katherine Langley Hatfield Scott and Lillian Lilly Scott Hatfield. There were some displays to remind us of how integral these women were to our family.

The central discussion at the Business Meeting was about the menu and venue of the Friday picnic. Phyllis Blackburn's family has been organizing the picnic and it has turned into a major endeavor. In addition, parents

who have memories of the picnic at the original location at Dewey Lake Dam would like to return to that location so the smaller children have a larger play area. The Reunion agreed that Phyllis and her family can cater the picnic and we will return to the dam as a venue. The Craig family and Trey Wright were given kudos for the inspiration and design of the 2016 t-shirts featuring Hatfield DNA.





Jeff and Polly's History Corner



One hundred seventy years ago, on October 13, 1847, Ephraim Hatfield died on Blackbury Creek, Kentucky, and was laid to rest in what is now the Anderson Hatfield Memorial Cemetery, named after his grandson, Anderson. Ephraim is sometimes referred to as "Eph of All" because virtullay all the Hatfields in West Virginia and Kentucky are his descendants.

Ephraim was born in Virginia about 1765, the son of Joseph Hatfield, a Revolutionary War Indian fighter and scout, and his first wife Elizabeth. Ephraim married Mary Smith, believed to be the daughter of Ericus and Bridget Anderson Smith. Ericus and Bridget were members of the Holy Trinity or "Old Swedes" Church in Wilmington, Delaware, where their marriage is recorded. A child has been named "Anderson" in many Hatfield generations since carrying forth the Anglicized version of Bridget's family name, "Andersdotter." Among Ephraim and Mary's children was Valentine Hatfield, the grandfather of Anderson "Devil Anse" Hatfield, the feudist.

After Mary's death, Ephraim had a family with Annie McKinney Musick Bundy and they were later married. The Indians had killed Annie's first husband, David Musick, and kidnapped her and her children. Ephraim was among the men who rescued her from the Indians. Among their children were George (our direct ancestor) and Jeremiah.

Sometime around 1820, Ephraim and his sons, Valentine, George, and Jeremiah migrated west. Valentine settled on what became the West Virginia side of the Tug River and George and Jeremiah settled on the Kentucky side of the Tug River, which resulted in Hatfield and McCoy Feud activities taking place in two different states..





Thanks, honey, for our precious love. Hand N Hand.


