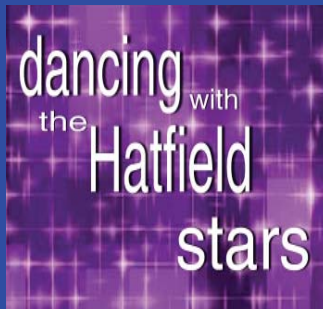

after her marriage to Thomas Wallace Runyon in 1860. She died in 1891.

After the auction and picnic concluded, the group met for PJs and Popcorn. The 1986-1988 Hatfield Reunion Highlight Movie premiered. After a rousing afternoon at the pool, the family convened for a business meeting and awards. We discussed whether the Reunion should be moved from Jenny Wiley, which has been its home since the beginning of the Reunion. While there is great concern about the need for renovation at the facility and the constrained staffing, the family decided to remain at Jenny Wiley.

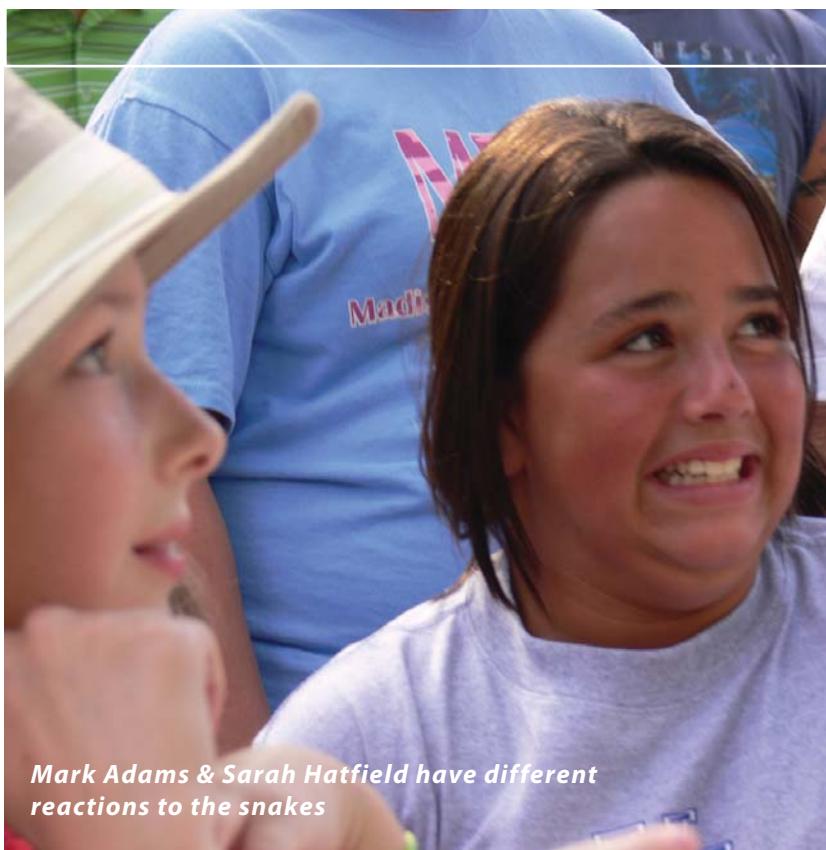

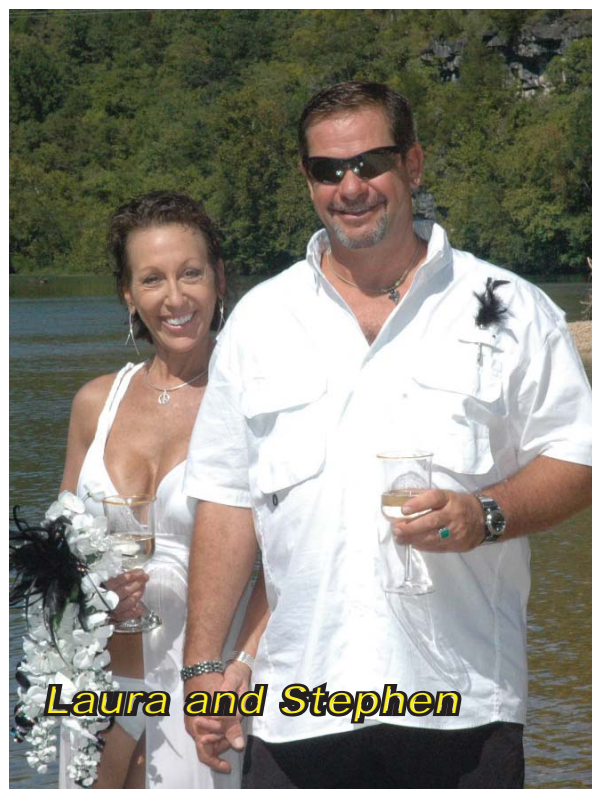


# Matters of the Heart

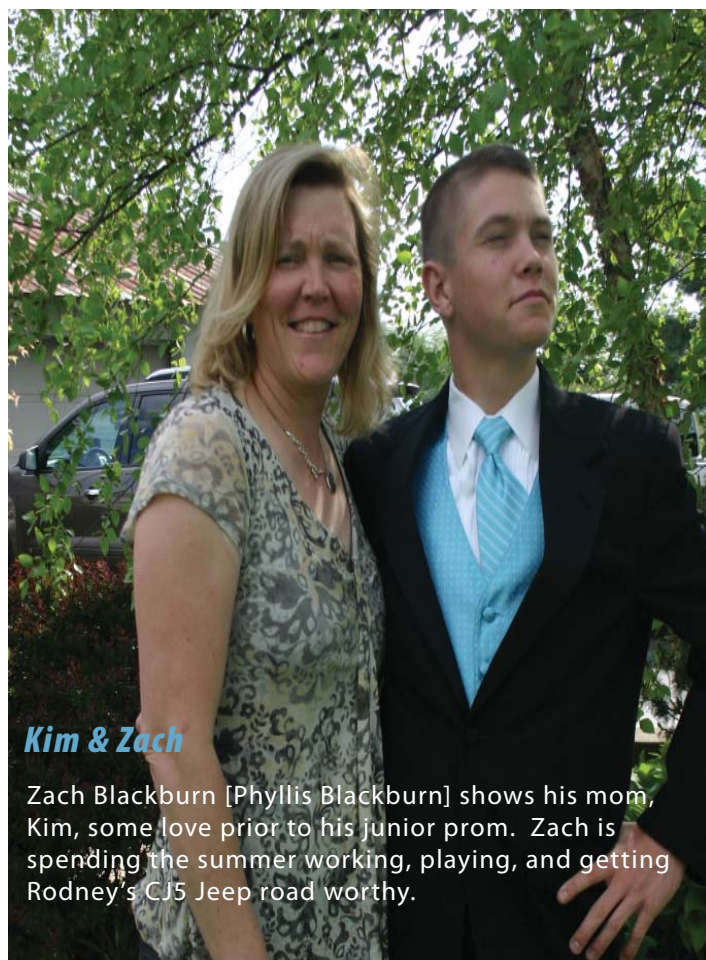
## **UNPRECEDENTED: Tom Hatfield elected to fifth term as Council president**

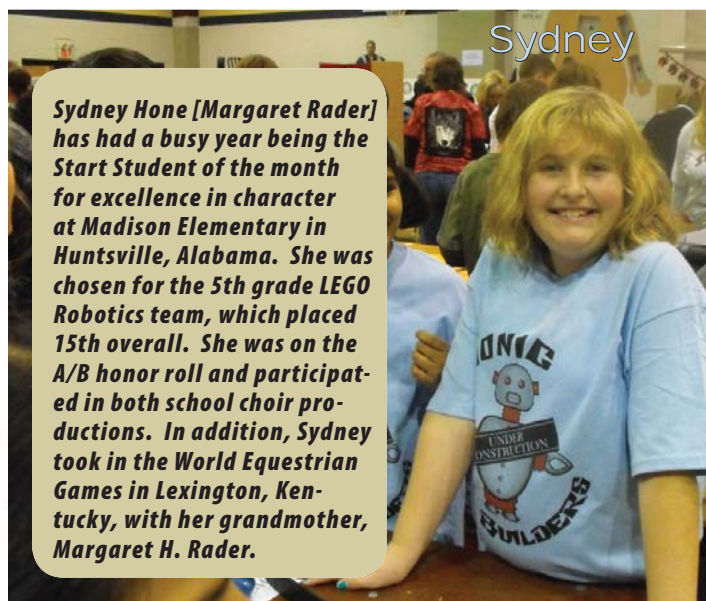
**Stuart**

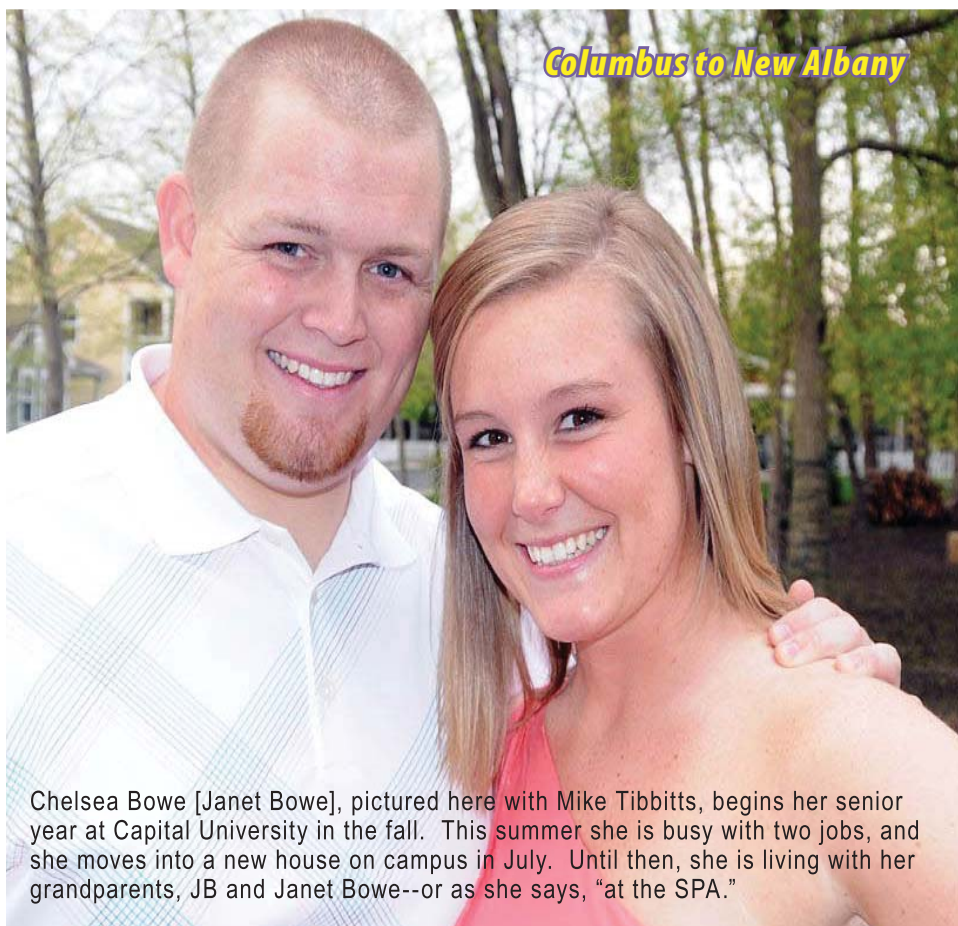
### Grand Cayman Island

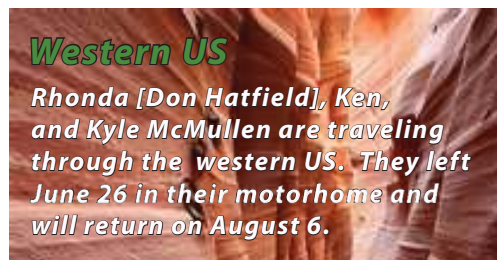
### Taylor
