after her marriage to Thomas Wallace Runyon in 1860. She died in 1891.

We discussed was whether the Reunion should be moved from Jenny Wiley, which has been its home since the beginning of the Reunion. While there is great concern about the need for renovation at the facility and the constrained staffing, the family decided to remain at Jenny Wiley.




Matters of the Heart
