

## Ed Rader, Lived to Age 91

James Edwin "Ed" Rader died in Lexington, Kentucky, on January 30, 2007. Ed was a Vice-President of the Jackson County Bank in McKee, Kentucky, prior to his retirement. He was a well-respected member of the Jackson County community having lived there all his life and having been a judicious and trustworthy man. He was a member of the Reformed Church, where he served as Deacon and Treasurer. He was a former member of the Kiwanis and the Boosters and was always involved in community projects.

Ed, the son of George Washington and Delia Wilson Rader, was one of nine children. Ed graduated from the Tyner High School and the University of Kentucky with a degree in Accounting.

Ed served in the Army in the Pacific Theater in World War II. In 2004, Ed visited the World War II Memorial in Washington, DC. Reflecting later, he said it was the best trip he had ever taken.

Ed married Margaret Ann Hatfield in 1960 and, by his account, was never on time after that. A small measure of his wit showed through when Ed said, "It's a helluva lot easier to be a Hatfield than to be married to one."

He dearly loved his family, but the lights of his life were certainly his granddaughters, Taylour and Sydney. He treasured his time with them.

Ed was a sportsman and sharp shooter who loved to hunt and to fish. He was also an avid University of Kentucky basketball fan, and he was acutely tuned to the events of the major sports. He enjoyed to exploits of his children as Myron played baseball and hunted, Lisa ran track and cheered, and Shelley played basketball. He was at every event with a word of encouragement.

In addition to his other talents, Ed had the proverbial green thumb and was a superb gardener. He not only cultivated his famous Jackson County green beans and tomatoes, he cultivated wonderful friends, whom he dearly loved and enjoyed.

With his family and his friends, Ed was very resourceful. He could see a problem and find a way to solve it or fix it. He was very utilitarian. He would take a \$10,000 chair and put a ten penny nail in it and say, "There, it is fixed."

Carrying on his memory are his wife, Margaret; his children, Lisa Maureen Hatfield Rader, Shelley Dawn Hatfield Rader, and Edwin Myron Russell Hatfield Rader; his grandchildren, Taylour Jordan Rader Hone and Sydney Morgan Rader Hone; and his sister, Joy Rader and many nieces and nephews. Ed was truly a wonderful man and he will be sorely missed by all of us as a husband, a father, a grandfather, a brother, and a friend.




# CHEERS FOR HATFIELDS


**Sidney Hatfield, top left, just made the 7th grade cheerleading squad for the Walnut Middle School football team and will also be on the cheerleading competition squad.**




**Maggie Blackburn, (right) has taken up T-ball and the care of a new terrier, Muffin.**

**Spencer did so well on the Junior Varsity basketball team in his freshman year that the coach moved him up to Varsity mid season.**








**Jack Caudill, 4, is the goalie for his soccer team. Ever now and then he has to take a break to get a drink, because being the goalie is thirsty work.**




# HATFIELDS ON THE GO




**After returning, Taylour attended a girl's basketball camp for her first time. She received an award for hitting 26 shots out of 40.**
